



1st St. & 22nd Ave. Infrastructure Repair and Replacement Project

CURRENT STATUS: (7/8/2016) Project complete June 2016.

WHAT IS THIS PROJECT GOING TO ACCOMPLISH? This project started as the 22nd Avenue and 1st Street Water Main Replacement Project created by an emergency waterline failure in December 2014. Albright & Sons of Lewiston completed the emergency work. Once the emergency work was finished, staff assessed the condition of all utilities prior to repaving the roadway. The disrepair of the road surface would definitely create an inconvenience to the neighborhood; however, the cost of paving the roadway and then the potential to reopen the road for further utility repair work did not seem feasible or make economic sense. It was determined the best approach would be to complete all repairs prior to paving since either choice would continue the inconvenience, so the choice that made the most economic sense was chosen.

HOW WILL THIS PROJECT BE FUNDED?

Emergency waterline repair work, \$162,000, funded by water fund revenue.
 Remaining stormwater, wastewater, and street repaving funded by gas tax revenues, water fund revenue, and wastewater fund revenue.
