IT IS ILLEGAL TO HAVE GLASS CONTAINERS IN THE CITY OF LEWISTON PARKS.
City Ordinance for the Ball Field Lights is that they MUST be off by 11:00pm.

Run Rule is 10 runs after 5 innings

- 1) Neither **SMOKING** nor Consumption of **ALCOHOLIC** Beverages is permitted on the field **OR** in the Dugouts.
- 2) **NO Metal Cleats.** Any player wearing metal cleats will be ejected from the game.

3) Any player displaying unreasonable conduct on the field, in the dugout, or adjoining area shall be automatically ejected from the game. The ejected player must leave the field and adjoining area and will be disqualified from the team's next played game.

4) Any player being expelled (for any reason) from two scheduled games will be disqualified for the remainder of the season. Any unsportsmanlike conduct displayed before, during or after a game may constitute grounds for disciplinary action against a team and or player.

Any player or spectator, who verbally or physically threatens an official, will receive a one-year suspension from all Parks and Recreation programs.

5) Any Team Member in a game using casual profanity or unsportsmanlike language (expletives not directed at an umpire(s) or opposing player(s) and loud enough to be heard by spectators, will result in an out being called against the offending team.

A. If a team is at bat and unsportsmanlike words are used, the NEXT Batter will be declared out.

B. If the act is committed by a player remaining at bat, that player will be declared out. If the batter is the third out, the out will carry over to the first batter in the next inning.

C. The outs will be treated as a delayed dead ball situation.

D. If the act is committed by the defensive team, the first batter in the next inning will be declared out.

E. If the violation occurs in the bottom of the last inning, where the fielding team may not bat again, the ejection rule will apply. If a team has an eligible substitute, they may make a substitution.

Otherwise, if a substitute is not available, the game will continue and the short handed rule applies.

F. A game may be ended by a casual profanity/unsportsmanlike language out.

G. Any player declared out by this rule because of a team members action will not be charged with an at-bat for record keeping purposes.

HOME RUNS 3 HOME RUNS AND THEN IT BECOMES PROGRESSIVE. AN OUT WILL BE DECLARED FOR ANY HOME RUNS THAT EXCEED THE LIMIT.

1) If a game has not been completed in seven innings or the one hour and fifteen-minute time limit, or a ten run lead after five innings, the umpire shall call the game at the end of the present completed inning. This will be a completed game for league standings. No new inning will be started after 1 hour and 15 minutes.

2) A five minute grace period shall be given from the scheduled starting time before a forfeit will be called or immediately after the preceding game is over, whichever is later. Any team which forfeits a league game will receive 1 1/4 game loss for league standings.

3) The time limit will be in effect for all games.

4) All players must wear some type of athletic shoes and must wear a shirt. No Metal cleats can be worn in any Leagues. No football shoes, or screw on metal cleats will be allowed in league play.

6) Games will not be rescheduled if teams cannot play them, games will only be rescheduled for rainouts or postponement due to inclement weather. Also, if special request is not met Parks and Recreation will reschedule game.

PROTESTS - All protests should be settled "on the spot". If this is not possible, the team must properly lodge a protest with the Umpire, Scorekeeper and Other Manager. The game will then continue to its conclusion. The Team Manager is responsible for having a written Protest to be submitted to the Parks and Recreation Office the next working day. The written protest must contain all elements listed in Rule 9, Section 6 of the ASA Rule Book. For example, The written protest should contain the following information:

A. the date, time and place of the game.

B. the names of the umpire(s) and Scorekeeper

C. the rule and section of the official rules and local rules under which the protest is made. (Official Rules: Rule 9 Section B. Local rule: Player Eligibility - A team can pick up 2 player to make 9 players for a game, but not to make 10. A pick up player will be declared before the game begins and must have permission from opposing manager, and must be written on score sheet with scorekeeper. A pick up player can ONLY be from one league above or any league below.)

D. the information, details and conditions relevant to the decision to protest

E. all essential facts concerning the matter protested.
