

HOW TO REPORT BIAS AND HATE CRIMES IN IDAHO

WHAT IS A HATE CRIME?

Hate crimes are outlawed by both the federal government and the State of Idaho.

Idaho law states that "it is the right of every person regardless of race, color, ancestry, religion or national origin, to be secure and protected from fear, intimidation, harassment, and physical harm caused by the activities of groups and individuals." I.C. § 18-7901. The state law protects people from physical harm, harm to property, and threats of physical harm or harm to property because of that person's race, color, religion, ancestry, or national origin. I.C. § 18-7902. The crime includes placing any word or symbol commonly associated with racial, religious or ethnic terrorism on the property of another person without his or her permission.

Federal law protects individuals from bodily injury or an attempt to cause bodily injury, through the use of a weapon because of the person's actual or perceived race, color, religion, or national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, or disability. 18 U.S.C. § 249. This U.S. law does not cover harm to property or threats. Another U.S. law protects individuals from injury or threats of injury based on race, color, religion, or national origin tied to specific activities such as voting, attending public school, and working. 18 U.S.C. § 245.

DO I HAVE TO BE A U.S. CITIZEN TO REPORT A HATE CRIME?

No. The U.S. Attorney's office, the FBI, the county prosecutors, and the local police will respond to reports of hate crimes regardless of your citizenship.

HOW DO I REPORT AN INCIDENT?

You have several options for reporting a potential crime: (See next page for contact information.)

- call your local police department,
- the county prosecutor's office,
- the FBI in Boise, or
- the U.S. Attorney's Office in Boise.

Make a report by phone and in writing. You can call more than one office to seek a response. Even if the incident is not serious enough to be a crime, reporting it helps officials respond if something happens again.

WHEN SHOULD I REPORT AN INCIDENT?

The sooner the better to allow officials to investigate, but you can still call and report an incident that happened weeks ago.

WHAT INFORMATION WILL I NEED TO PROVIDE?

If you can do it safely, make video or audio recordings and take pictures. Write down what happened, where it happened, and when it happened. Get the names and contact information for any witnesses.

CAN I HAVE A LAWYER, PARENT, OR FRIEND WITH ME?

Yes. The official responding to the information may need to speak directly with you but you can have someone with you to help explain what happened and provide support.

WHAT IF THE INCIDENT HAPPENED AT A SCHOOL, JAIL, OR HOSPITAL?

If you are in a public school, file a formal grievance. Look on your school district or college website for grievance and civil rights policies. Ask jail officials or hospital employees for their grievance procedure and file a report.

INFORMATION TO GATHER AND REPORT

Who was targeted: (Name, address, contact information)

Description of incident:

(Be sure to identify dates, times, location, and the names of everyone involved if possible).

Witnesses and their contact information:

What about the incident makes you feel it is a hate crime (specific slurs, writings, etc.)

Actions taken so far: (Has the incident been reported to anyone and to whom).

Write down what happened, with as much information for any witnesses.

Response to actions so far (if any):

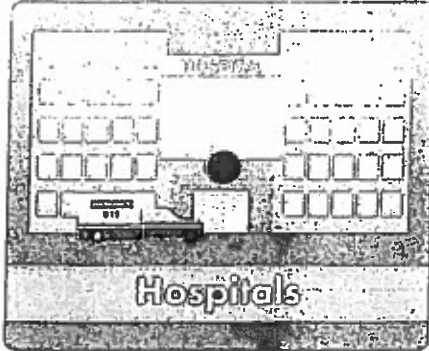

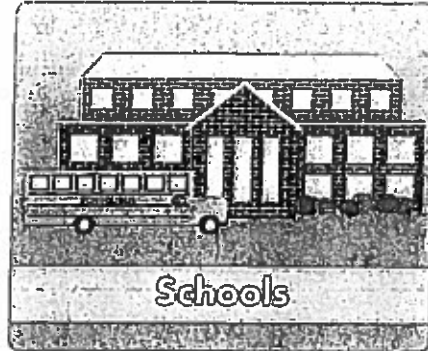
What are sensitive locations?

Immigration enforcement actions generally are not to occur at sensitive locations, such as:



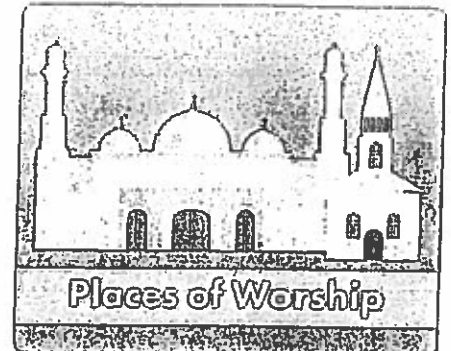
Hospitals

Hospitals



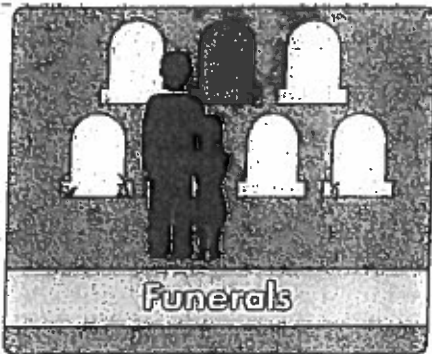
Schools

Schools (all levels from preschool through college, also vocational and trade schools)



Places of Worship

Places of worship or buildings rented for religious services



Funerals

Public religious ceremonies, such as funerals



Weddings

Public religious ceremonies, such as weddings



Demonstrations

During a march, rally, parade or other public demonstration

Special exceptions for sensitive locations

Actions may occur at these locations in special circumstances including:

- someone who poses an imminent threat, such as a national security risk
- immediate pursuit of a felon or person who poses danger to the public
- risk of destruction of property

ICE Officers' Conduct in Exceptional Circumstances

If actions may occur at these locations in special circumstances, ICE officers follow these guidelines:

- Officers must have obtained high-level ICE approval
- Officers must make substantial efforts to avoid alarming the community
- Officers must be discrete and limit their time at the sensitive location
